ASHE - Harrisburg Selects 2008-2009 "Member-of-the-Year" (MOY)

The Harrisburg Section of the American Society of Highway Engineers (ASHE) recently bestowed upon one of its members the annual "Member-of-the-Year" (MOY) award at its 2009 Annual Banquet held at the Commissioned Officer's Club, Naval Inventory Control Point, Mechanicsburg, PA. The award was presented to Kathy M. Weiser (McCormick Taylor, Inc., Engineers & Planners, Harrisburg Office) on May 8, 2009.

This prestigious award is presented to a single member of the Section annually at the Annual Banquet. The MOY award winner is selected based upon their commitment and dedication to the Harrisburg Section, the ASHE organization as a whole and the highway/transportation engineering profession in general. Consideration for this award is determined by the various activities and functions (both past and present) that a member has provided or currently provides.

Ms. Weiser has been: 1.) an ASHE - Harrisburg Section member; 2.) a member of the Harrisburg Section's Board of Directors (serving in capacities as a Director - 1-year, 2-years, and 3-years; as a 2nd Vice-President; 1st Vice-President; Section President [2006-2007], and as an Immediate Past President); 3.) she has been involved with our past National Conferences (including being very much a part of the hugely successful 50th Anniversary Conference held last summer in Hershey, PA and hosted by the Harrisburg Section - (the originating Section of the formation of the entire ASHE organization); 4.) and for the 2009-2010 year as a returning Harrisburg Section Board of Directors member again.



Some of the ASHE - Harrisburg Section's activities and accomplishments that occurred while Kathy was our Section President, and which are a testament of her leadership and management abilities include some first time events such as: 1.) the restoration and re-dedication and of the Pinchot Monument (July 21, 2006) which commemorated the 75th anniversary of the Pinchot Road legislation (in getting the farmers out of the mud), 2.) the first of our "FORMAL" Younger Member Focus (YMF) Happy Hours (to recruit new members), 3.) and the 1st CANstruction Design/Build Competition in Central PA (all money [\$2,400 in cash] and canned goods [1,500 cans of food] benefited the food banks of Central PA). Also during her tenure as our President, she provided leadership in stewarding the Board of Directors, Standing Committees, and Ad-Hoc Committees, as the Section continued other events such as: 1.) our 8th Annual Golf Outing (where over \$8,000 was raised for college scholarships), 2.) our annual joint picnic and casino night with PSPE and ASCE, 3.) 2nd year construction tours of the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission's Susquehanna River Bridge, 4.) our Annual Photo Contest, 5.) our participation in the celebration of Engineer's Week at the Central Pennsylvania Engineer's Week Council, 6.) the Patriot-News Science Fair (held at Dickinson College), 7.) the 3rd Annual ASHE - Harrisburg/PennDOT District 8-0 Conference (where there were over 220 attendees, including 40 PennDOT personnel), 8.) Adopt-a-Highway Litter Pick-ups, 9.) the Annual Banquet honoring our Past Presidents, 10.) and contributions to various charities (amounting to almost \$1,000 in cash, canned goods, and toys for tots).

Congratulations Kathy on receiving this very distinguished award. We look forward to your continued involvement and commitment to ASHE and the highway/transportation industry.
