1. **AMOUNT:** A minimum of seven (7) scholarships up to \$4,000 each will be awarded. The amounts will be paid as lump sum awards. There are three separate scholarship categories: ENGINEERING; ENVIRONMENTAL/APPLIED SCIENCES; or CONSTRUCTION TECHNOLOGY/TRADES. Each category will be scored separately but applicants can only apply toward one scholarship category.
2. **ELIGIBILITY:**
 - a. The applicant must be a citizen of the United States and reside in one of the following counties: Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Juniata, Lancaster, Lebanon, Perry, or York.
 - b. There are three (3) scholarship categories options. Applicants must choose one category. The categories are: (1) 4-year program for engineering; (2) 4-year program for environmental/applied sciences; (3) 2-year program for construction technology or trade school certification for heavy equipment operator CDL.
 - c. The applicant must be enrolled in, or planning to enroll in, a four-year college program leading to a bachelor's degree in engineering, preferably civil engineering; four-year degree in environmental/applied sciences; or, a 2-year degree or trade school equivalent leading to certification in construction technology/trade, building technology/trade, or heavy equipment operating CDL license.
 - d. The applicant must not have previously received an ASHE scholarship unless it was awarded while they were a high school senior. A student can be awarded one as a high school senior and one as a college or trade school student.
 - e. If selected, the recipient will be contacted by email/letter notifying receipt of the award.
3. **EVALUATION:** Applicants are evaluated on a point-count system as described below:
 - a. Academic Performance, 25 points maximum as follows:
 - i. High School seniors, College and Trade school students will be rated on their cumulative grade point average at the time they apply for the scholarship.
 - b. Application Evaluation, 50 points maximum as follows:
 - i. Evaluation of the applicant's activities and honors, work experience, and leadership positions (30 points maximum).
 - ii. Evaluation of career goals, based on content, clarity of ambitions, grammar, spelling, and neatness (20 points maximum).
 - c. Bonus: Applicants can receive additional scoring points for the following criteria:
 - i. Enrollment or plans for enrollment in a Civil Engineering major, 14 points maximum.
 - ii. Dependent of a member of ASHE, Harrisburg Section, 5 points maximum.
 - d. Science/Math Teacher Evaluation for High School Students: The student's science or math teacher should provide an objective evaluation regarding academics and character on the enclosed "Science/Math Teacher Recommendation Form." This form must be mailed separately from the student's application or provided in a sealed envelope initialed by the teacher and included with the application package.
4. **INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING APPLICATION FORM**
 - a. Be as complete as possible while filling out this application. Each portion of the application has a specific point value. Judges will score each section separately. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
 - b. Forms must be typed or neatly printed. Points may be lost for poor grammar, incorrect spelling, illegibility, or lack of neatness. Proofread carefully.
