due in the April timeframe. We are looking to expand the offerings to capture more career fields within the transportation industry. I would like to thank Alan Williamson, PE and the scholarship committee members for their efforts.

An update and specific data on the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act that was recently passed into law as it relates to Pennsylvania. In data taken from Governor Wolfe's office, the law will bring billions of dollars to Pennsylvania to improve roads and bridges, increase access to public transportation, build out clean energy infrastructure, expand broadband and more. As most of us are aware there are more than 3,300 bridges and over 7,540 miles of highway in poor condition throughout the state. In the last 10 years, commute times have increased by 7.6% in Pennsylvania, and on average, each driver pays \$620 per year in costs due to driving on roads in need of repair. The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act will send \$11.3 billion to Pennsylvania for federal-aid highway programs and \$1.6 billion for bridge replacement and repairs over 5 years. Pennsylvania can also expect \$2.8 billion over five years to improve public transportation across the Commonwealth, meaning reliable transit for workers and families. The Act also provides funding for the first-ever national network of electric vehicle (EV) chargers, including \$171 million for Pennsylvania to expand its EV charging network and lead efforts to address the climate crisis and support American manufacturing jobs. This legislation would send \$1.4 billion to Pennsylvania to replace lead pipes, improve water infrastructure and deliver clean, safe drinking

water across the Commonwealth. Airports in Pennsylvania would receive approximately \$355 million for infrastructure development over five years. This will certainly help but it will not completely fill the projected \$15 billion per year that PennDOT estimates is needed to maintain its highways and bridges. As this is extremely good news for our state there is much more work that needs to be done.

Finally, I would like to wish you all the merriest and safest of Holidays and the Happiest and Healthiest New Year for the coming 2022. 2021 has been a year to remember (or forget!!). I would like to thank all the Harrisburg ASHE Board members and general membership for their hard work and dedication throughout 2021. I look forward to our time together and producing good work in 2022.

In Memoriam



Robert "Bob" L. Milliken, Jr., 77, of Coatesville passed away on November 15, 2021 surrounded by loved ones. He was the beloved husband of Patricia Milliken with whom he shared 53 years of marriage.

He served in the US Navy from 1962 to 1970 and was deployed in Vietnam in 1966 and 1967. After active duty he attended Charleston Institute of Technology and received his degree in Mechanical Engineering. After college and moving to Pennsylvania, he served four years in the Active Reserves. Throughout his professional career Bob served in various leadership positions and at the time of his retirement was president of Underground Services, a subsurface utility engineering firm. Post-retirement, he stayed within the industry working with InfraMap Corp as a consultant.

In the spirit of service, after his retirement, Bob served pro bono as the Interim Executive Director of the Chester County Association for the Blind and was an active member of the Coatesville Area Lions Club, serving as the president from 2016-2017.

He was an active member of the American Society of Highway Engineers (ASHE) and served as Delaware Valley president in 2007-2008. Bob also was a member of the American Society of Civil Engineers where he received the 'Engineering Manager of the Year' award in 2012.

By virtue of the admirable and generous accomplishments above, Bob epitomized service, family, friendship, and patriotism. He is a true hero to all who have known him.





2022 ASHE NATIONAL AWARDS NOMINATIONS DUE TO HARRISBURG SECTION BY JANUARY 24, 2022

The Harrisburg Section on behalf of ASHE National is now soliciting Nominations for the following Awards:

- Robert E. Pearson/Person of the Year,
- Young Member of the Year,
- Member of the Year, and
- Lifetime Achievement

These awards will be presented during the Annual Banquet dinner at the 2022 National Conference to be held in Columbus Ohio.

Award Nominations are due to ASHE National by February 15, 2022. To meet this deadline, nominations need to be submitted to the Harrisburg Section to the attention of Paul McNamee, (paul.mcnamee@kci.com), Harrisburg Section Awards Committee Chairperson, by January 24, 2022 for review and forwarding to ASHE National by February 15.

The requirements for each of these awards are presented in the ASHE Operation and Resource Center, which can be found on the ASHE National Website at www.ashe.pro. Please review these requirements carefully and remember to submit ALL required documents for your nominees, as outlined in the ASHE National Guidelines.

The following is a brief overview of each award:

Robert E. Pearson/Person of the Year:

The Pearson Award is given to an individual who has made notable and significant contributions to the transportation industry. The contributions should have a statewide or broader impact and involve paid and personal time and efforts, and participation in transportation-related societies or organizations. Membership in ASHE is not an eligibility requirement.

Evaluation Criteria:

- Notable achievements related to the highway industry more current events will be weighted more heavily (40%)
- Involvement in highway-related societies and organizations (20%)
- Personal time spent for the good of the industry (15%)
- Respect of his/her peers (15%)
- Statewide or broader impact to highway industry (10%)



Young Member of the Year:

This award has been established to recognize young ASHE members who have made outstanding contributions to the highway/transportation industry and their communities during the early years of their careers. To be eligible for nomination, candidates must meet the following criteria: must be 35 years of age or younger as of January 1, of the year the award is to be presented and must be a member in good standing and active with ASHE.

Evaluation Criteria:

- ASHE activities (25%)
- Professional/career achievements (20%)
- Professional and technical society activities other than ASHE (15%)
- Civic and humanitarian activities (15%)
- Educational achievements (10%)
- Letter(s) of reference (10%)
- Completeness of the application (5%)

Member of the Year

This award is for ASHE Members only and the Section should consider members who have significantly contributed to ASHE.

Evaluation Criteria:

- Notable achievements with ASHE within the past year (30%)
- Impact to ASHE (20%)
- Personal time for the good of ASHE (15%)
- Respect of their ASHE peers (10%)
- ASHE offices held (10%)
- Letter(s) of Reference (10%)
- Year the nominee joined ASHE (5%)

Lifetime Achievement

This award is for ASHE Members only and was established to recognize an ASHE member who has supported the organization throughout their career.

Evaluation Criteria:

- Impact to ASHE and other notable achievements (30%)
- National/Region/Section Offices held (30%)
- Year the nominee joined ASHE (15%)
- Service on National/Region/Section Committees (15%)
- Corporate/Government positions held (10%)

2022 NATIONAL PROJECT OF THE YEAR AND HARRISBURG SECTION AWARDS ELIGIBILITY AND SUBMITTAL REQUIREMENTS

The ASHE Harrisburg Section is inviting Section Members to submit applications for the ASHE National Project of the Year. In addition, the ASHE Harrisburg Section will be selecting Section Awards from these submittals. The Section Project Awards will be honored at the June, 2022 dinner along with the Section's Student Scholarship Awards. The National Project of the Year will be recognized at the ASHE Annual Conference in Columbus Ohio, May 12 -15, 2022. (DUE DATE FOR APPLICATIONS TO BE PROVIDED LATER. WILL BE EITHER LATE DECEMBER 2021 OR IN JANUARY 2022).

ELIGIBILITY

Any project that is substantially completed by December 31, 2021 and no more than two calendar years immediately prior to the American Society of Highway Engineers (ASHE) National Annual Conference shall be considered eligible for the National Project of the Year competition provided that the project involves at least one of the following transportation features:

- Highways/Roadways
- Bridges
- Traffic Control/Signalization (Includes ITS)

- Railroads
- Public Transit
- Bikeways and Multi-use Paths

Projects submitted through the ASHE Harrisburg Section must be located within the geographical boundaries of the following counties: Dauphin, York, Adams, Lancaster, Perry, Franklin, Lebanon, and Cumberland.

AWARD CATEGORIES

The project entries must fall within one of the following cost categories:

- Projects up to \$20M in construction cost
- Projects over \$20M in construction cost

One project from each category will be selected by the Section as National Project of the Year nominees. These projects will then be forwarded to the ASHE Northeast Region for competition with the other Northeast Region Section projects for judging for submission for the ASHE National Project of the Year competition. Section Project Awards will also be selected form these submittals.

AWARD ENTRY SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The following represents the minimum that must be submitted to the Section by late December, 2021, early January, 2022 (the specific date will be determined and distributed to Section Members once the National and Regional submission deadlines are announced):

- A completed ASHE Project of the Year Entry Form. (available at <u>www.ashe.pro</u>).
- A letter from the client or owner that the project was substantially completed and open to the public by December 31, 2021.
- A narrative of the project not exceeding 1500 words (single sided, 12-point font, 8 ½ "x11" pages); the narrative must address the 6 categories in the scoring and judging criteria below.
- Project construction costs.
- Up to five (5) five construction drawings on 11"x17" sheets that are relative to the scoring and judging criteria.
- Up to five (5) photos (maximum size: 8 ½"x11") that are relative to the scoring and judging criteria.
