A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

In the first newsletter, I touched on the Vision created by the Board. With each newsletter, I hope to drill down a bit further into each area. This month I'd like to focus on events. At ASHE, we realize we can accomplish our mission and vision through a lot of our events. Our events provide opportunities for professional development hours, client and peer networking, and student engagement. Our events also fund our scholarship program. These events, however, are not possible without the hard work of our Board and participation from our membership. Did you know that the pricing structure is basically break even for most events? Generally, our golf outing, annual renewal dues, PennDOT Executive Luncheon, PTC Troeg's Happy Hour, and our Annual Conference generate funds to support the scholarships we provide every year. This year, we have also added some new and exciting events including a Jingle and Mingle happy hour event in December, a pop-up happy hour in January, a joint event with ASHE Williamsport in March, and a Senators baseball game in June. We hope to see you at as many of these as you can get to.

Time seems to move much faster for me in the Fall as our industry events start to pick back up. As most of you are probably aware, I have the high honor of working for the PA Turnpike Commission. Have you ever wondered what it's like to represent the owner's side at events? At a Turnpike workforce development event recently, one of our project managers shared that he is the best version of himself at work. Sometimes that doesn't leave him with enough energy to be the best version of himself at home. Representing the owner's side can be both exciting and challenging. One challenging aspect is that there are more events than one person can possibly attend, and I receive invites to a lot of events. Before almost every event, I review the list of attendees to help me remember names. However, I personally get anxiety attending large events, because I feel like I may not

remember all of the names I probably should remember. Sometimes I come home from the events absolutely drained because I struggle balancing so many conversations throughout the day. I have some very close friends in the consulting industry ask about tips on how to engage owners at events when competing for attention. You may get different advice from different people, but I would generally say it's about (1) a shared personal connection and (2) basic etiquette. Although we are obviously associated through our industry, the last thing people sometimes want to hear about is work. I personally want to hear about you and find a personal connection. Also, good etiquette is extremely important when approaching a person you wish to talk to when they are already engaged in a conversation. I have had some highly personal conversations about serious life issues cut short, and it is awkward for everyone involved. Be sensitive to body language and facial expressions as clues to what you may be interrupting. So, if someone is always in a conversation at an event, how do you ever get to say hello? Being present and patient usually works for most. If it doesn't, a simple wave with a follow up email always works. In fact, the follow up emails help with the name recognition, too. The exciting part on the owner's side is that we have a lot of choices on what events to attend, and we are able to meet so many incredible people. With meeting so many people, I have been able to gain very valuable experiences and advice that have helped with my career. One easy example for me to point out would be interviewing for the position I hold now. The rough draft and final draft look very different as a result of conversations with some of you. Also, aren't we all willing to work harder and respond guicker to someone we have a strong connection with?

So, as our season ramps up, I hope some of this helps you and I hope to see you at our next ASHE Harrisburg event.




